Resort Policies

Sun Meadow Resort is a family facility. Experience has taught us that all of our guidelines originate in one rule, which we expect of ourselves as well: Be kind and respectful to yourself and others. Appropriate behavior is always expected.

Photography:

It is prohibited unless it has been approved in advance by resort management.

Fire Safety:

Obey all fire safety rules. Wood fires are not permitted. Fires are permitted only in containers such as barbecue grills. Smoking is not permitted on trails.

Water Safety:

Swim at your own risk. No lifeguard on duty. Use caution on pool deck, it may be slippery. Glass is prohibited in enclosed areas around pool and hot tub. If you need plastic, we can help! Please shower with soap before using pool or hot tub. Children who are not toilet trained must use leak-proof swimming diapers in the pool or hot tub. Little Swimmers are available for purchase in the office. People with open wounds, bandages, infectious diseases, etc. may not use pool or hot tub.

Parents:

Responsible for their children's safety and behavior.

Pets:

Bags are available in the office at no charge for clean-up. Keep all pets on a leash or confined and happy. Threatening dogs are not allowed. A dog yard is available for guest use. Please notify the office before putting a dog in the dog yard.

Quiet Hours:

Quiet hours are 10:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. Sunday through Thursday, and Midnight to 8:00 a.m. Friday and Saturday nights and designated holidays. Quiet hours are particularly important around hot tub because sound carries there.

Alcohol:

Sun Meadow is not licensed to sell alcohol, but guests are welcome to bring their own. When using alcohol, keep in mind that Sun Meadow is a family resort, and when you mix kids with adults, you get role models.

Smoking:

Cigarettes, cigars, e-cigarettes, and any other legal form of smoke is permitted only in designated smoker-friendly areas. Please ask for the smoking tips in the office. Please note that marijuana possession or use is not legal in Idaho.

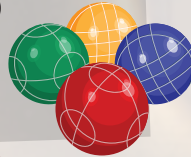

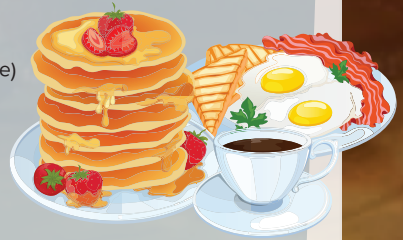

Rules of Business

"Where there is, radical difference of opinion in an organization, one side must yield. The great lesson for democracies to learn is for the majority to give the minority a full, free opportunity to present their side of the case, and then for the minority, having failed to win a majority to their views; gracefully to submit and to recognize the action as that of the entire organization, and cheerfully to assist in carrying it out, until they can secure its repeal."

– Henry Robert, Parliamentary Law

The business meeting will be recorded.

MOTION PROCEDURES:

All motions are to be written on the AANR Motion Form and forwarded to the president.

WHEN A MOTION IS ON THE FLOOR:

- Speakers are limited to three minutes per speech.
- In the debate, each member has the right to speak only twice on the same question.
- Members cannot make a second speech so long as any member who has not spoken on the question desires the floor.
- Speakers shall be recognized to speak alternately for or against a pending motion.
- When speaking to a motion, the member should indicate whether he speaks in favor of the motion or in opposition.
- The presiding officer cannot cut off the debate as long as one member wishes to rise and speak.
- Any member can "move the previous question" which immediately stops debate. The motion needs a second, is not debatable, and requires a two-thirds vote to adopt.

The secretary/treasurer will record the results of each motion on the AANR Motion Form.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

All committee reports not previously circulated are to be presented to the secretary/treasurer for distribution. Previously circulated reports will not be read.
